Faculty Coordinator Spotlight: Stephen Thomson

Stephen Thomson brings over 20 years of experience in leadership roles in information technology and supply chain management. Before joining Conestoga in 2005, Stephen developed analytics solutions— such as dashboards, scorecards, and visualizations—to enhance operational performance. His research focuses on supply chain analytics and sustainability, including logistics visualizations, predictive analytics, and Industry 4.0. He led the award-winning Bloom Net Zero Living Lab research project, which received the 2022 Kostuch Media Green Leadership Award. An accomplished case writer, Stephen

earned the NACRA 2024 Best Bronze Case Award for Purity Life: Perfecting the Perfect Order Rate and the Best Paper at the 2023 ASAC Conference for Managing Production at Sienci Labs: Push or Pull.

School of Business, offering SAP tools and resources in 9 courses across 7 programs and involving 14 faculty members and 1,500 students in the 2022/23 academic year. The curriculum covers SAP S/4HANA, ERPsim, SAP Analytics Cloud, and includes a pilot integration of SAP SuccessFactors in collaboration with the University of Victoria for HR courses. SAP tools support subjects like Business Processes, Supply Chain Management, Managerial Accounting, Human Resources, and Analytics and Decision Making.

Joint Academic Boards Highlight

In October, the DACH Academic Board, North American Academic Board, Ibero-Americas Board, SAP Academic Board APJC, and Sub-Saharan Academic Board met to discuss COIL (Collaborative Online International Learning). COIL connects students and faculty from different countries through digital platforms to collaborate on projects and assignments, promoting cross-cultural understanding and

global engagement without traveling. This approach enhances students' international collaboration, communication, and problem-solving skills through virtual teamwork.

A featured COIL project shared during the meeting was the collaboration between the Symbiosis Center for Information Technology in India and the University of Applied Sciences in Germany. This project uses design science and design thinking methodologies, bringing together students from both institutions to solve real-world challenges. Over the years, it has expanded, fostering cross-cultural collaboration and providing students with valuable international experience while preparing them for future global challenges through virtual teamwork and industry partnerships.
