Faculty Coordinator Spotlight: Dr. Douglas Battleson, PMP

Doug Battleson has 27 years of experience in SAP technologies and methodologies. Before joining East Tennessee State University (ETSU) in 2023, he was a U.S. Army officer serving in Germany during the Cold War and forward deploying to Desert Storm, has 20 years in industry, including 16 years with SAP America Delivery Services, and then recruited into higher education in 2014. Since then, he has been the Faculty Coordinator at multiple universities using the SAP University Competence Center (UCC) services.

One of the key challenges at these universities is working to implement these systems and services into additional departments and curriculums beyond the information systems courses. Doug noted, "Though the SAP UA ecosystem is strong and friendly, I've been fortunate enough to continue working with the University of Wisconsin- Milwaukee (UWM) UCC where I enjoy a trusted and enjoyable relationship. The trust I have in the UWM UCC leadership and staff frees me up to focus on challenges and opportunities to grow these services in my university."

Doug's academic and research interests include the intelligent enterprise, de-escalation of information systems projects, sensemaking, and dynamic capabilities. He has contributed to initiatives such as establishing a M.S. in Information System Enterprise Systems concentration, generating \$5.5 million of top line growth from 2016 to 2018, and a B.S. in Business Administration Intelligent Enterprise degree leveraging the SAP University Alliances program. Such innovative initiatives led to the MSIS Top Professor Award, the Dr. Lars Mathiassen Decade Impact Award nomination, and most recently the Outstanding New Faculty Award nomination in the College of Business & Technology at ETSU.

Founded in 1911, East Tennessee State University (ETSU) serves around 14,000 students in the Appalachian Highlands region with a mission to improve quality of life locally and beyond. The Department of Computing, established in 1977, offers four ABET-accredited programs—computer science, cybersecurity and modern networks, information systems, and information technology—making ETSU the only university with all four accreditations. A member of the SAP University Alliances for 16 years, ETSU integrates SAP tools such as S/4HANA, Signavio, and ERPsim into four courses across multiple programs, engaging four faculty and over 500 students in 2024. These tools support instruction in areas including Business Process Integration, Configuration, and Enterprise Programming (ABAP). Several courses are offered in the M.S. in Information Systems, with new options for Master of Accountancy students beginning Fall 2025.

When asked about the biggest challenge of being a Faculty Coordinator, Doug shared, "Keeping up with the incredible pace of new technologies from SAP University Alliances and ERPsim Lab—like SAP Signavio, SAP Analytics Cloud updates, ERPsim Business Builders, the Manufacturing Sustainability game, and competitions—is a wonderful challenge to manage and implement." He's also focused on expanding faculty engagement across the College of Business & Technology, including accounting, finance, supply chain, and pedagogy, where colleagues increasingly recognize the value of information systems and SAP.

Despite the demands, Doug finds the role deeply rewarding. "My favorite part is living the three Es from my 1998 SAP bootcamp: Educate, Empower, and Exit—let students stand on their own. I strive to bring the best technologies and teaching methods to the classroom, colleagues, and industry partners to help build the next best future," he said.

Key Themes from UA-COM and Research Day 2025

Certification Updates

As discussed over the last year, the Integrated Business Processes with SAP S/4HANA (TS410) offering through University Alliances is sunsetting on June 30th. Please work directly with your UCC if an already announced course has been scheduled. The <u>End-to-End Business Processes for the Intelligent Enterprise</u> course is its successor. The course has been completely redesigned to focus on key business processes in SAP S/4HANA Cloud Public Edition and introduces the suite of SAP solutions that come together to support a company. *Hint: The new certification exam requires completion of the end-to-end process learning journey PLUS the two-hour <u>Managing Clean Core with SAP S/4HANA Cloud</u> learning journey. Exam questions come from both sources. These learning journeys are showcased on Student Zone.*

<u>TS410 reminders:</u> Once your student completes the Learning Hub, student edition subscription process they can use their free certification attempt(s) for this exam. Students must book the **C_TS410_2022** exam as it aligns with content you are teaching and the SAP S/4HANA version your UCC provides. Students will go to the general <u>TS410 certification</u> page, choose the link "**previous exam version C_TS410_2022**" and follow the prompts to verify availability of the

exam attempt and schedule. If your students completed the self-paced course available from SAP then the default "2504" exam is appropriate.
